Rebuilding 17th cent (1658-84) including porch and upper part of tower. Series of rebuildings and enlargements 19th cent, south aisle added 1856, chancel, chapels and south arcade 1885, second south aisle added 1889.</p>

Floor levels raised or lowered: Possible original south wall of nave and base of jamb found under south arcade in excavation in 1982. These features found under two limestone floor surfaces. Jamb suggested to have originally been a cross base (this stone is now in the grounds of the church hall- it is a square block, roughly tooled on three sides with a socket in the centre).
