


## RECOGNISING MODERN SLAVERY

Learn how to spot the signs of modern slavery, what to do if you encounter it and how you can report it



Victims of modern slavery can be of any age, race, or gender. There is no 'typical' victim. However, there are physical and behavioural indicators that may mean someone is being exploited.



## APPEARANCE

- Show signs of physical or psychological abuse and untreated injuries
- Look malnourished or unkempt, or appear withdrawn and neglected
- Seem under the control or influence of others
- Wear the same clothes every day
- Wear no safety equipment even if their work requires it



## ACCOMMODATION

- Living in dirty, cramped or
- overcrowded accommodation
- Living and working at the same address
- Appear unfamiliar with their
- neighbourhood or where they work



## TRAVEL



**SEEKING HELP** 

Rarely allowed to travel on their own Reluctant to seek help and Collected and dropped off on a avoid eye contact regular basis early in the morning Frightened or hesitant to talk or late at night to strangers In a crowded minibus with Fear of police, don't know who to other workers trust or where to get help • Have no control of their identification Afraid of deportation, and of the risk documents such as their passport of violence to themselves or their family

What to do and who to contact if you spot the signs or are worried that someone might be trapped in modern slavery.

As with other crimes, it is important that you report any suspicions of modern slavery to the police. Do not attempt to intervene yourself, as you may put yourself and those around you – including the potential victim – in danger.

HOMELESS PEOPLE ARE AT RISK OF MODERN SLAVERY They are targeted by traffickers at drop-ins, shelters, and on the streets.



They are offered work and promised money, and sometimes alcohol or drugs.



The promises will turn out to be a lie. They will work long hours for little or no pay and under threat of violence. Have you heard stories of... Being approached at a shelter or drop-in by someone offering work Physical abuse or untreated injuries

 Unusual anxiety of those in positions of authority
Extreme fear of being

 Extreme fear of being watched
Working for no/little pay
Working in high risk areas like construction or hand car washes
Not being allowed to leave their place of work

Having no control of ID
