

Changes to COVID-19 restriction from Monday 28 September

The CofE digital team have updated the Recovery Group papers and FAQs section of the national website in response to the changes that come into effect from today, 28 September, and including an FAQ regards Remembrance Sunday.

Please note the CofE Birmingham specific guidance for Halls and Buildings, previously issued by the Archdeacons is superseded by the updated national paper.
