

Bishop David on the recent IICSA report

I am fully supportive of IICSA's scrutiny and approach to ensure our Church is a safe place for all, as reflected in their Report published on October 6th. In addition, I acknowledge the difficult reading this report may be for victims and survivors, and those close to them. I am grateful for the courage shown, that ensured these truths are exposed.

'In the context of child sexual abuse, the Church's neglect of the physical, emotional and spiritual well-being of children and young people in favour of protecting its reputation was in conflict with its mission of love and care for the innocent and the vulnerable' – IICSA report 6th October 2020

As one, with colleagues across the Church of England and the Archbishop of Canterbury, I express sincere apologies and acknowledge deeply the truth of this statement.

Acknowledging the Church has failed to respond well to victims and survivors of child sexual abuse, I welcome the continuing independent enquiry PCR2 and offer full support to continual outworking of the General Synod motion committing to a victim and survivor centred approach and support, including arrangements for redress.

I renew my, and the Church of England Birmingham's, commitment to robust and new safeguarding practices in all of the Church's settings.
