What is a ID Group?

ID groups are about us being intentionally changed and transformed – in our character, habits, choices and lifestyles. They are about helping us to pay attention to the Lord and His leading. **They are based** on the reality that every Christian disciple is called to be a blessing and serve God's kingdom, but most of us need help living that way.

ID groups are made up of 4-5 people who meet every 3-4 weeks, for one hour.

Who is it for?

If you want to grow as a Christian, are willing to be shaped and changed by God's Spirit, and to learn from others, an ID group could be for you. It suits any kind of person. There are no 'entry requirements'. because it's about relationships. It can work for a wide variety of people.

It is for a season only, not forever. Those who are in the group will grow in confidence in their own discipleship, and by experience into being able to disciple others.

Why Mentoring?

We grow through relationships and learn most when we are able to see

how to live out our faith modelled in the lives of others. This provides a good way of keeping us honest and feeding back to each other about our journey.

Why Discipleship?

Jesus' Great Commission was not to build the church, but to make disciples – apprentices of Christ who would grow in being with Him, becoming like Him and doing the things He does. It's the fulfilling purpose of every human being's life!

ID groups assume that God wants to speak to each Christian, and for His kingdom to break into our daily lives. They help us change because of they balance support with challenge (we need both to really transform) and help us to be accountable friends to each other.

Each ID group always finishes by asking each person, 'What question would be helpful for me to ask you next time?'
